Did you know that a man is 33% more likely to get prostate cancer than a woman is to get breast cancer? It's true. A husband, father, son, brother, grandfather, or friend dies every 17 minutes of every day from Prostate Cancer - But they do not have to.

Two members of the Kilkarney Hills Golf Club – and patients at Metro Urology - were not too afraid or embarrassed.

Larry Bauer, age 63 of Hudson, WI, was first diagnosed with Prostate Cancer in 2002. After successful surgery, Larry remained cancer free until 2008, when a routine PSA screening exam detected a recurrence. Radiation treatment ensued and today Larry remains cancer free – but vigilant with the help of Metro Urology.

Michael Straley, age 69 from Oakdale, MN, became a patient at Metro Urology in June 2009 when diagnosed with Prostate Cancer. He and his family were very concerned with the importance and immediacy of the issue as well as the continued after-care which would follow his operation. Scared, nervous and unfamiliar, Michael sought the valued opinion and guidance of Larry, a fellow golfer who had already gone through diagnosis and treatment, and who recommended Metro Urology for his treatment and patient after-care.

Cancer free since the surgery, both Michael and Larry now want to spread Prostate Cancer awareness to all people and share their success stories.

Raising awareness about Prostate Cancer is more important than ever before. The American Cancer Society released a study in 2009 stating that Prostate Cancer is 100% curable when caught in the early stages and confined within the prostate.
